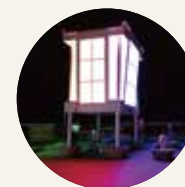

A city embraced by water and flora, Tokushima City

Home to 134 rivers, including the Yoshino River - the largest river on the Shikoku Island - Tokushima City is nicknamed the "City of Water". The city's landmark, Mt. Bizan, reflects the colorful changes of the seasons. The excitement of the Awa Odori summer festival, and the charm of the local cuisine, tradition, and culture can all be experienced in Tokushima City. The more you explore, the more you will discover in this fun city.

Mt. Bizan

Bizan Park, located at the top of the mountain, is a popular cherry blossom viewing spot with a wide panorama enjoyed from the observatory. It also has beautiful sunsets and night views, with a driving course, a ropeway, and hiking routes to the mountaintop.

Yoshinogawa Bridge (Yoshinogawabashi)

Yoshino River

The Yoshino River (Yoshinogawa), nicknamed the "Shikoku Saburo" (Saburo meaning "third son"), is considered one of the top rivers of Japan at 194km long, and 1.3km wide at the river's mouth.

Tokushima City's Awa Odori festival is by far the largest of the Awa Odori festivals held throughout the prefecture, and one of the largest summer festivals in Japan. The dance can be watched throughout the city center at several spectator venues called enbujo, or on most streets within the festival area. Over the five days of the festival, more than 1 million visitors from throughout Japan and overseas flock to Tokushima.

The Origins of Awa Odori

Among many, there are three main theories regarding the origins of Awa Odori.

O-Bon Dance Theory

As the name of the theory suggests, Awa Odori is thought to have been performed around Tokushima Castle as a local style of dance for O-bon (a Buddhist festival to honor ancestors). Modern Awa Odori may have evolved from the niwaka odori, kumi odori, and zomeki odori, which are varying styles of folk dances performed by the general public.

Furyu Dance Theory

Starting in the Muromachi era (1336 - 1573 CE) in the middle ages, furyu odori is a combination of various forms of urban folk dance. Records of it being danced in Tokushima during the Tensho period (1573 - 1592 CE) have led to the belief that the Awa Odori emerged from furyu odori.

Castle Construction Theory

Following the construction of Tokushima Castle in the year Tensho 14 (1586 CE), the feudal lord Hachisuka Iemasa issued a decree allowing commoners to openly celebrate the completion, suggesting that Awa Odori emerged from the jubilant dancing that occurred during the festivities.

Paid outdoor theaters are set up for those who want to enjoy Awa Odori in a relaxed atmosphere as you sit and watch the dance. Both paid and free venues are spread across the city, imbuing the whole town in the Awa Odori color.

You can enjoy these indoor Awa Odori stages with unique performances unlike any that can be seen at the main festival. Approximately six hundred exceptional master dancers, carefully selected by both the Awa Odori Promotion Association and the Tokushima Prefecture Awa Odori Association, give the ultimate performance known as "A Stage Of Masterful Dancers **SUGURIBI**." "Dream Stage **MATSURIBI**" offers an elaborately staged performance by dance teams selected by both the Awa Odori Promotion Association and the Tokushima Prefecture Awa Odori Association.

Encounter the world of Awa Ningyo Joruri.

Ningyo Joruri (puppet theater) is said to have originated on Awaji Island at the end of the 16th century. In Tokushima, it was patronized and encouraged by Lord Hachisuka of Awa during the Edo period and became a popular entertainment form. Tokushima boasts the largest number of existing rural stages in Japan. There are also permanent stages in the city, so you can experience the charm of Ningyo Joruri all year round.

Awa Deko Hakomawashi Folklore Museum* Awa Deko Cultural Museum "Ningyo no Mura"

This facility is dedicated to the passing down of Awa Deko Hakomawashi tradition and to spreading the charm of Awa Deko culture. A permanent exhibition includes over 300 dolls from the end of Edo period to Showa era, as well as masterpieces by master craftsmen Tengu Hisa I, Ningyo Tomi, Ningyo Chu, and others. Among them are the precious "163 pieces of Awa Deko Kadozuke Equipment" (National Important Tangible Folk Cultural Property) viewable exclusively in this museum.

History and Culture Woven through Tokushima



Tokushima Castle Museum & Omotegoten Garden of Old Tokushima Castle

Edo period Awa (modern-day Tokushima Pref.) and Awaji(part of modern-day Hyogo Pref.) prospered under the Tokushima Domain. This museum hosts an abundant collection and exhibit of artifacts that represent the domain's prosperity. Adjoining the museum is a beautiful palace garden in a style inspired by the Momoyama period (1583-1600 CE). The magnificent greenstone, dry bed garden, artificial hills, and pond provide plenty to be enjoyed.

Awa Historic Park (Awa Shiseki Koen)

Created to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Tokushima municipal organization, Awa Historic Park consists of a Historical Culture Zone, Ancient Life Zone, Historic Forest Zone, and Nature Experience Zone, where visitors can encounter existing ancient burial mounds and recreated pit houses. The Kinobeyama tumulus clusters are located in the vicinity, with a scattering of more than 100 burial mounds dating from the late 3rd to the mid-7th century.

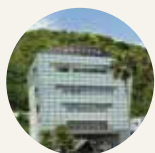

Komatsu Beach in northern Tokushima City is popular for surfing and other water sports. There are many surf shops in the city offering surf lessons where beginners can easily get started.

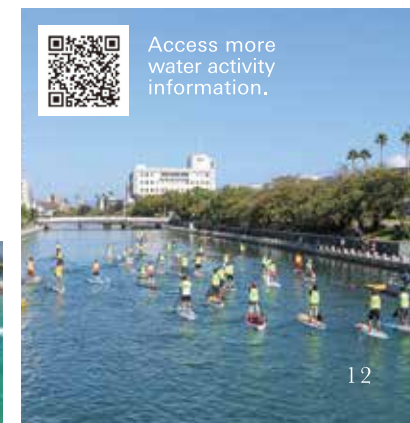


SUP Experience

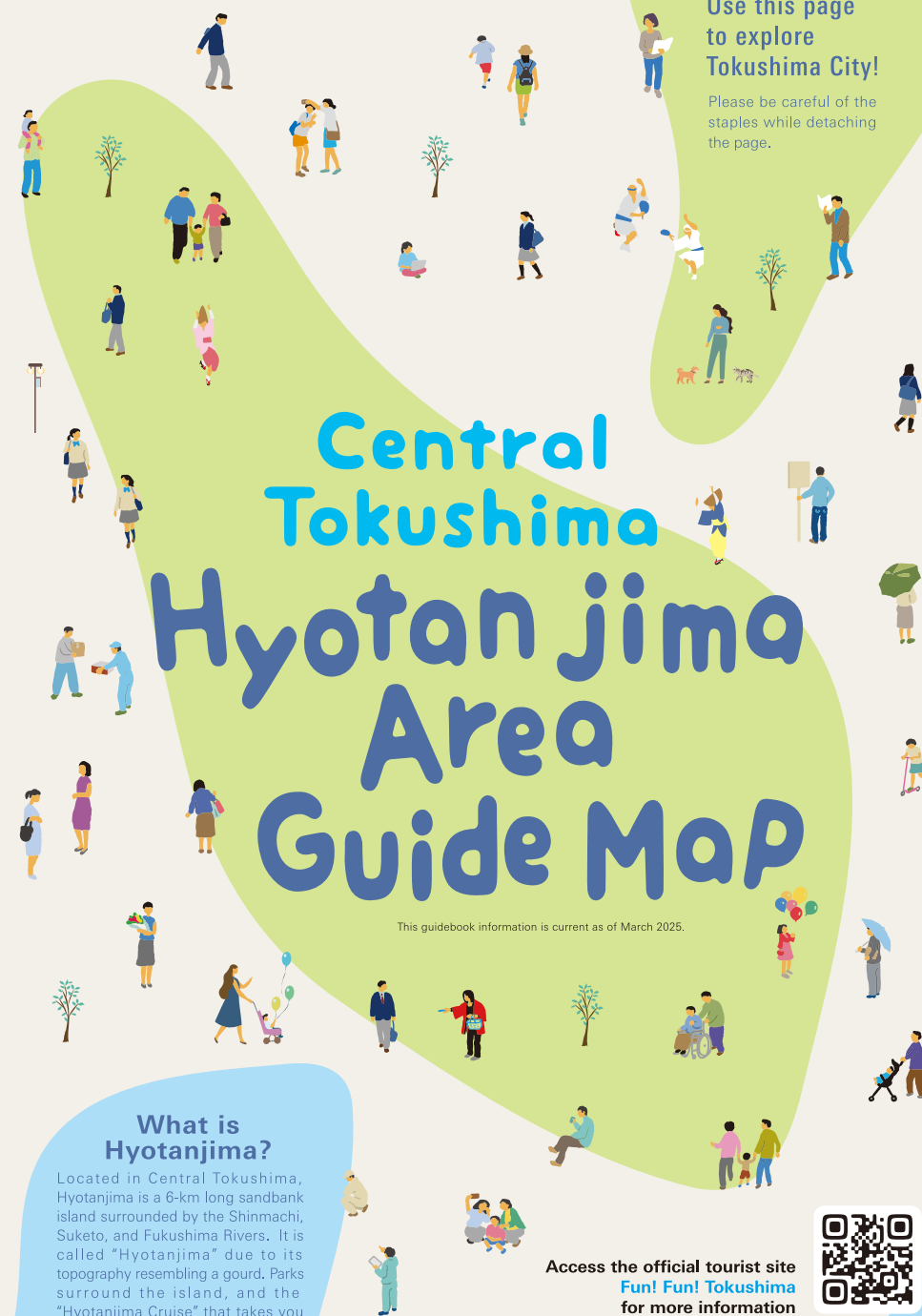

What is Hyotan jima?

Located in Central Tokushima, Hyotan jima is a 6-km long sandbank island surrounded by the Shinmachi, Suketo, and Fukushima Rivers. It is called "Hyotan jima" due to its topography resembling a gourd. Parks surround the island, and the "Hyotan jima Cruise" that takes you around the island is popular as well.

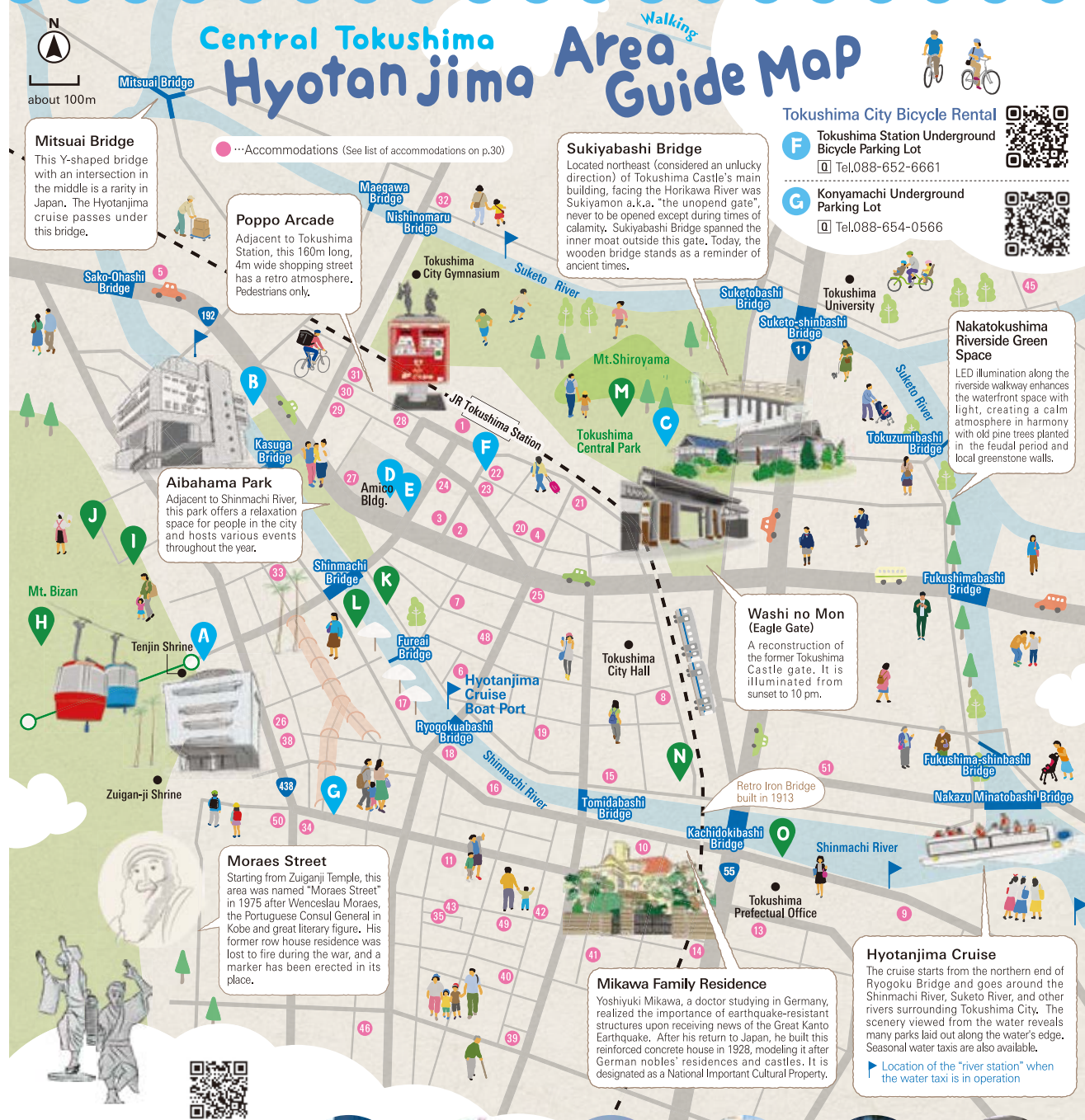

H Mt. Bizan

The mountaintop observatory is the best viewing spot in the city, offering a wide panorama of Tokushima City and the Kii Channel.



I Teramachi and Kinryosui Spring

Kinryosui has been one of the main springs of Mt. Bizan its water since the time it was favored by the Tokushima domain lords. The stone water-drawing station is a landmark of Teramachi (Temple town).



J Otaki and Taki no Yakimochi

Otaki waterfall is located at the lush green northern foot of Mt. Bizan. Visit the teahouse for "Taki no Yakimochi", a specialty confectionery with a 400-year history.



K Shinmachi River Awa Paper Riverside Park

Designed for visitors to get in touch with water with step-terraces made of greenstone and granite. There is also a monument of Jakuchō Setouchi, a Tokushima-born Buddhist nun and writer.



L Shinmachi Boardwalk

Wooden boardwalk on the opposite bank of the Shinmachi River Awa Paper Riverside Park where a marché is held every last Sunday of the month.



M Tokushima Central Park

The park is established on the former Tokushima Domain Lord Hachisuka's castle ruins, which is designated as a national historic site. It is also one of the best cherry blossom viewing spots in the city.



N Nakasu Fish Market

Affectionately known as Tokushima City's kitchen, there are not only stores selling seafood and meat, but also natural food stores and restaurants.



O Kenchopia

A yacht harbor in front of the prefectural government office. Familiar and symbolic cityscape of Tokushima where you can also enjoy Christmas illuminations.





Cruising

Hyotanjinma Cruise

The Hyotanjinma excursion boat operates daily except on New Year's Day. It cruises around Hyotanjinma, a sandbank island surrounded by the Shinmachi and Suketo Rivers in Central Tokushima. The 6 km course takes about 30 minutes starting from the floating pier at the northern end of Ryogokubashi Bridge. During the open-air, roofless cruise, you can enjoy Tokushima city from the river, waving to people strolling in the park while taking in the view of Mt. Bisan from a whole new perspective.

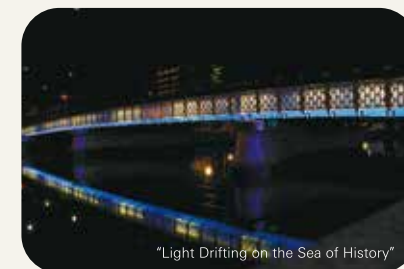

The Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage associated with Kobo Daishi (Kukai) was certified as Japan Heritage in 2015, attracting many visitors from both Japan and overseas. Tokushima Prefecture is the starting point of the Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage. The temples from 13 "Dainichi-ji Temple" to 17 "Ido-ji Temple" are located in Tokushima City, and have been popularly known as "Gokasho Mairi (five-temple tour)" since olden times. The approximately 8 km-route is relatively easy to follow and recommended for those wishing to experience the pilgrimage on foot.



Temple 13 : Dainichi-ji

Legend states that following the divine instructions from the Buddha Vairocana (Dainichi Nyorai), Kobo Daishi sculpted a statue of the Dainichi Nyorai and founded this temple with the statue as its principle object of worship.

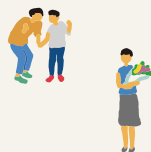

Teramachi Quarters

During the growth of Tokushima's jokamachi (castle city), Buddhist temples were relocated to this area. The charming atmosphere makes it a popular place for locals to take walks. Mt. Otaki is crowded with people enjoying cherry blossoms in springtime, and around the hiking trail entrance are famous "Taki-no-Yakimochi" grilled rice cake cafes.

Kinryosui Spring

Kinryosui is one of Tokushima City's many natural springs. It was treasured as a source of the feudal lords' as well as local residents' drinking water.



Kogen-ji Temple

This is the familial temple of the Awa Province Hachisuka feudal clan. This temple is where huge tombstones of the successive generations of feudal lords were placed, and has been designated as a national historic site.

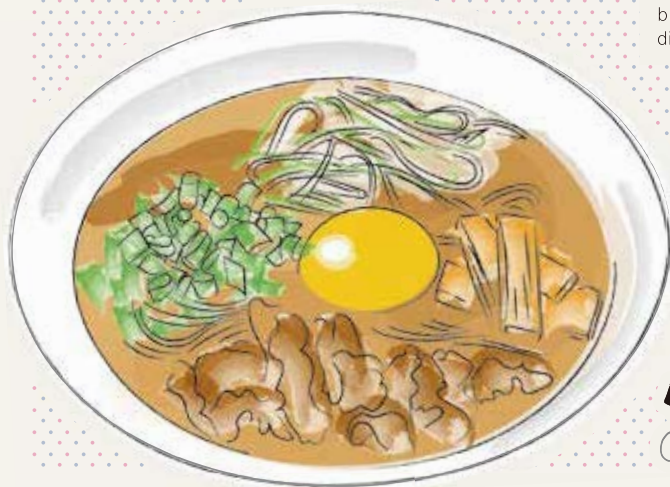

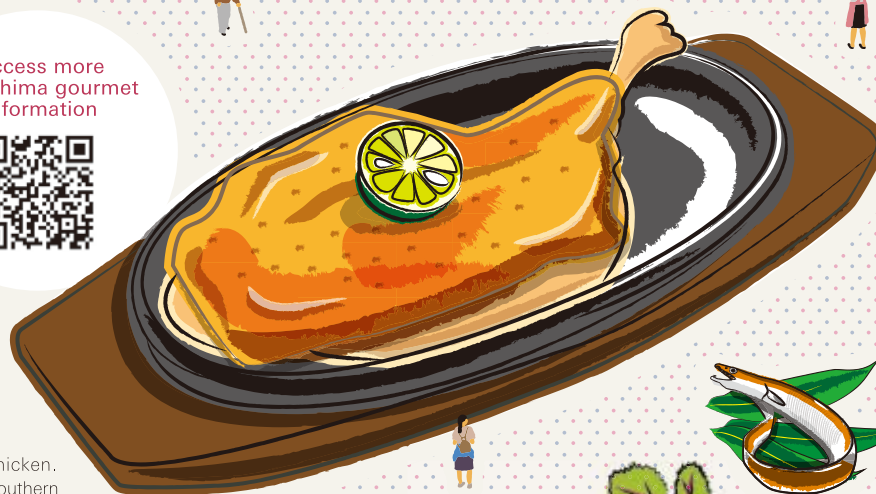

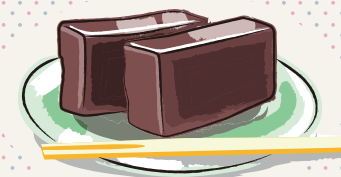
Naruto Kintoki Sweet Potato

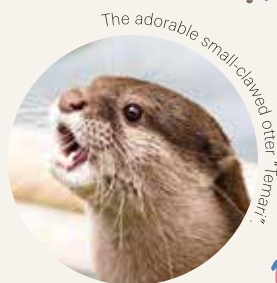

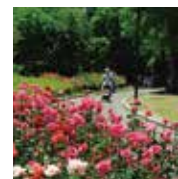

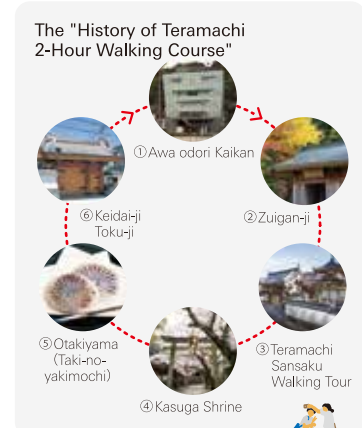
